## National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day to take place this Saturday - 04/25/2013

This weekend, Seminole County residents will once again have the opportunity to safel y dispose of old, expired or unwanted prescription medications. The Seminole County Sheriff's Office (SCSO) is teaming up with the Drug Enforcement Administration, the S eminole Prevention Coalition and area law enforcement to recognize National Prescript ion Drug Take-Back Day.

On Saturday, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. prescription drugs may be turned in at the following 12 locations:

The service is free with no questions asked. Disposing of unwanted medications through approved drop-off locations helps eliminate the possibility of abuse, misuse and diversion.

National prescription drug disposal events are held twice a year. At last September's event, 601 pounds of prescription drugs were collected in Seminole County, and across the country, citizens turned in 488,395 pounds (244 tons) of unwanted or expired m edications at more than 5,263 take-back sites in all 50 states and U.S. territories.
