Extensive knowledge of interviewing and counseling techniques.

Ability to conduct interviews and psychiatric assessments in a timely manner while documenting the current status and functioning level of the mentally ill offender.

Ability to make recommendations concerning the documentation, processing, and disposition of mentally ill inmates.

Ability to determine levels of lethality and disposition of inmates suffering from mental illness who are determined to have the potential to be harmful to themselves or others.

Ability to work independently without constant supervision; to communicate effectively, both orally and in writing; to establish and maintain effective working relationships with Sheriff's Office personnel and personnel from allied services and agencies.

#### **Other Necessary Requirements**

*Mobility*-Mostly sedentary work but some standing and walking; constant use of a computer.

Lifting-Able to lift at least 10 pounds.

*Visual*-Constant overall vision; constant eye-hand coordination; frequent reading/close-up work.

Dexterity-Frequent repetitive motion and reaching.

*Emotional/Psychological* Potential contact with hostile individuals; direct inmate contact, exposure to emergency situations; may be exposed to trauma, grief and death; frequent public contact; decision-making and concentration.

**Special Requirements**- Ability to behave respectably and with utmost integrity even when off duty. May be required to respond for any critical incident, manmade or natural. Some assignments may require working weekends, nights, and/or occasional overtime.
