WORKING CONDITIONS

The work environment is an office atmosphere although the incumbent is frequently required to meet with victims at crime scenes or at a hospital/medical facility.

PHYSICAL ATTRIBUTES REQUIREMENTS

Mobility-Frequent sedentary work; constant use of a computer; *Visual*-Constant overall vision; constant color perception, constant eye-hand coordination; constant depth perception; frequent reading/close-up work; constant field of vision/peripheral;

Dexterity-Frequent repetitive motion and reaching; Foot and hand coordination; *Hearing/Talking*-Constant requirement to hear normal speech; constant hearing on telephone and radio; ability to hear faint sounds; constant talking on telephone/radio; *Emotional/Psychological*- Potential contact with hostile individuals; exposure to emergency situations; may be exposed to trauma, grief and death; frequent public contact; decision-making and concentration;

Special Requirements-Ability to behave respectably and with utmost integrity even when off duty. Work may including working weekends, nights, holidays, and/or overtime; May be required to respond for any critical incident, manmade or natural.
