#### **Social media helps identify Wekiva Island burglary suspect**

SEMINOLE CO. (June 15, 2015)-Seminole County Sheriff's Office (SCSO) arrested Connor McBreen-Fasano, 17, of Orlando for his role in a Wekiva Island vehicle burglary after social media followers tipped investigators to his identity.

On June 3, the victim reported that she parked her vehicle in the parking lot near the Wekiva Island boathouse at around 10 a.m. Two hours later the manager notified her that her vehicle window had been smashed. When the victim went to investigate she discovered that two Coach purses, a wallet and cash were missing from inside. The incident was captured on surveillance cameras and showed the subject used a rock to break the vehicle window and then fled on foot with a purse under his arm.

On June 4, the SCSO posted to our social media sites a still photo taken from the surveillance video and asked the public for help to identify him. Investigators immediately began receiving a large number of tips from SCSO social media followers identifying McBreen-Fasano as the person in the photo. Investigators checked McBreen-Fasano's Facebook page to conduct a photo comparison. They found he posted a photo of himself earlier that day wearing the same t-shirt that he was seen wearing when he committed the burglary.

Investigators arrested McBreen-Fasano on Friday and charged him with burglary, grand theft and criminal mischief. He is currently still incarcerated in the Juvenile Detention Center.

The SCSO sincerely thanks our social media followers for helping us identify the suspect and we appreciate the continued partnership of our residents in preventing and investigating crime in our community.
